
CLUB NOTES:

Inner Rhythm is a growing group of heart-centered-people who dance as a way of returning to our selves and to commune with each other.

For us the dance floor is a playground, a teacher, a healer.

There are no steps to follow, no right or wrong way to move, we dance to feel what is sacred through the movement of our bodies.

Inner Rhythm is a 70-90 minute dance journey. Every Inner Rhythm dance is different but the basic format is the same. We start with slower fluid rhythms, move into pulsing percussive beats, peak into wild chaos, then return with trance-like lyrical rhythms dissolving into a quiet gentle stillness.

We finish with a short closing circle.
