Friday Night Ecstatic Dance!

Inner Rhythm is a growing group of heart-centered-people who dance as a way of returning to our selves and to commune with each other.

For us the dance floor is a playground, a teacher, a healer.

There are no steps to follow, no right or wrong way to move, we dance to feel what is sacred through the movement of our bodies.

Inner Rhythm is a 70-90 minute dance journey. Every **Inner Rhythm** dance is different but the basic format is the same. We start with slower fluid rhythms, move into pulsing percussive beats, peak into wild chaos, then return with trance-like lyrical rhythms dissolving into a quiet gentle stillness.

We finish with a short closing circle.
